

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT & CEO

HSCC has seen its fair share of change over the last year. We said goodbye to long-standing employees and welcomed new staff; we saw an increase in demand for affordable veterinary care and **expanded our Community Pet Clinic**, providing a record 2,513 wellness visits and surgeries; we planned a facility expansion project that allows us to continue meeting the ever-changing needs of our community.

Animal welfare is a rapidly evolving field and HSCC continues to be at the forefront of innovative practices that **prioritize the strength of the human-animal bond** and reduce pet relinquishments.



2023 was the first full year of our Foster-To-Adopt program for canines, giving adopters an opportunity to see how a dog fits into their lives in real time. Consequently, we saw a 14% increase in dog adoptions and a 40% decrease in returns. We rehomed 1,188 animals, found foster families for 600 animals, and helped hundreds of pets and families stay united through our programs and services. We welcomed thousands of visitors to our facility and served over 150 students through our humane education programs.

Accepting change provides us with the opportunity to embrace new and better ways of doing things. The only thing that HSCC guarantees not to change is **our commitment to go above and beyond** to serve our animals and our community's needs. We cannot accomplish this work without **your support**. HSCC'S COMMUNITY PET CLINIC: CHANGING LIVES, ONE SPAY AT A TIME



Last October, we received an ASPCA & Subaru Loves Pets grant that provided spay/neuter surgery for 21 dogs at no charge to their owners. For one of our clients and their dogs, this was a life-changing opportunity. The family had several intact dogs, resulting in large numbers of puppies. We first helped through our Spay the Mom program, spaying one mom and adopting out the puppies. With the grant in October, we were able to help spay and neuter the rest of the adult dogs, alleviating the stress of constant litters being born. In 2024, we are excited to implement a new grant, The Irving and Phyllis Millstein Foundation Spay and Neuter Fund, which will provide free spay/neuter for dogs whose owners have limited resources. 

PETUNIA BLOSSOMS AFTER MEETING HER NEW BEST FRIEND

In September 2022, the Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) assisted federal agents in rescuing 275 dogs from an alleged dogfighting operation in South Carolina. Dogs were found living outside in pens along with objects and equipment typically used in dogfighting. We don't know exactly the trauma these dogs endured, but we do know that the conditions they lived in and how they were treated was not humane.

Petunia was one of the lucky survivors, and HSCC was honored to take her in and help her make a fresh start here in Vermont. Her new owner understood Petunia's needs, and came to meet her several times to slowly build a bond with her before taking her home in May 2023. After a brief Foster-To-Adopt period, these two became the best of friends, and it's clear that our sweet Petunia has finally found a place to call home.

She enjoys giving hugs and kisses, snuggling, going for rides, and playing with her toys on my couch that she's taken over. She is still fascinated with the toilet. She's blossoming like a beautiful flower! She's my Petunia."
