HSCC's mission is to keep pets with the people who love them. We understand that sometimes owners need a little help to care for their furry family members. The Surrender Prevention services below are available to residents of Chittenden and Grand Isle Counties. Contact us for more information or to request assistance.

Pet Helpline

Do you have questions about your pet's care or behavior?

HSCC's Pet Helpline is here to answer questions about pet care, offer guidance for training or behavior modification, and provide referrals to other services. Pet owners can call 802-862-0135 ext. 29 or email helpline@hsccvt.org to access this free service.

Spay the Mom

Do you have a pregnant or nursing cat?

HSCC provides care to mother cats and their kittens, usually in local foster homes, until they can be safely separated. Mom and her kittens are all vaccinated, microchipped, and spayed or neutered, free of charge. Once she has been spayed, the mother cat is returned to her owners and all of the kittens are made available for adoption.

Free Food Shelf

Do you need help with food for your pet?

HSCC maintains a free food shelf at our facility, where owners can find food and other supplies to help care for their pets. Available supplies may vary from time to time and are limited to two items per household per month. Available during open hours: Tuesday-Friday, 1-6 and Saturday 10-4.

Good Neighbor Program

Do you need temporary housing for your pet?

HSCC provides shelter and care for owned animals for up to two weeks when their owners experience crisis or transition. During their stay, pets are fed, socialized, vaccinated, microchipped, and spayed or neutered, free of charge. Owners must be working with a social support agency or organization to qualify, and the program is completely confidential.

Rainy Day Pet Fund

Do you need help with necessary medical expenses for your pet?

HSCC offers financial assistance to owners who are unable to pay for their pets' unanticipated emergency one-time medical treatment. Requests for funding are reviewed on a case-bycase basis and assistance is dependent on available funds.
